amphibians	Amphibians live in the water as babies and on land as they grow older. They have smooth, slimy skin.
birds	All birds have a beak, two legs, feathers and wings.
fish	Fish live and breathe underwater. They have scaly skin, fins to help them swim and they breathe through gills.
mammals	Mammals are animals that breathe air, grow hair or fur and feed on their mother's milk as a baby.
reptiles	All reptiles breathe air. They have scales on their skin.
carnivore	Animals that mostly eat other animals (meat) are carnivores .
herbivore	Animals that only eat plants are herbivores .
omnivore	Animals that eat plants and other animals (meat) are omnivores .




Structure of Animals



Animals are all structured differently but they might have some similarities. Some features we may look at on animals are tails, claws, shells, tentacles, fins or tusks.

Fish and Birds

Fish are cold-blooded animals. They live in water and have fins to move and gills to breathe underwater with. **Fish** have skeletons on the inside of their bodies and they lay their eggs in the water.

Birds are warm-blooded animals. They live on land and water. **Birds** have feathers, wings and a beak. No other type of animal has feathers except **birds**! Just like **fish**, **birds** have skeletons on the inside of their bodies and they also lay eggs but usually in a nest.

Amphibians and Reptiles

Amphibians and **reptiles** have some similarities. Both types of animals can live on land or water and lay egg. However, reptiles tend to have dry skin but amphibians have moist skin!
