

## Key Words

harvest	<b>Harvesting</b> is the process of gathering a ripe crop from the fields.
parable	A <b>parable</b> is a simple story that has a lesson or moral within in it. Parables are used within the Bible.
primary colours	The three <b>primary colours</b> are red, blue and yellow. These colours cannot be created by mixing other colours.
secondary colours	<b>Secondary colours</b> are colours which are a result of mixing two <b>primary colours</b> together.
rights	<b>Rights</b> are principles that all people are entitled to, to help make the world fair.
responsibilities	<b>Responsibilities</b> are things which people have to do to ensure others can enjoy their rights.
climate	The <b>climate</b> describes the weather in an area in general.
