capital city	The capital city, often called the capital, is the one from where the government of a country functions. All offices like parliament or the highest court of justice are situated in the capital.
landmark	A structure (such as a building) of historical interest or one that looks appealing.
United Kingdom	Part of the official name for the British Nation. It includes England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.
tones	How light or dark something is.
melody	A group of notes of various pitches (how high or low a sound is) which are played one after another. Some people like to sing melodies.

Zakat


Muslim's follow the five pillars of Islam. Zakat is one of the five pillars. Zakat means giving charity to the poor. This charity can be food, clothes or money.
