
Great Britain is the largest island in the British Isles, it is made up of three countries: England, Scotland and Wales.

Maps are used to identify cities, regions, counties, physical and man-made things.




Sheffield is part of the Yorkshire and the Humber region. We live in South Yorkshire, which is a county.
