

<i>sight</i>	<i>Your eyes let you see all the things around you.</i>
<i>hearing</i>	<i>Your ears let you listen to all the things around you. Your brain is able to tell what the different sounds are.</i>
<i>touch</i>	<i>Your skin gives you the sense of touch. You can tell if something is warm, cold, smooth or rough without even looking at it!</i>
<i>taste</i>	<i>Your sense of taste comes from your tongue. You can tell if something tastes bitter or sweet.</i>
<i>smell</i>	<i>You smell using your nose. Your nose can tell if things smell nice or not.</i>
<i>senses</i>	<i>Your senses allow you understand the world around. There are five main senses: sight, touch, smell, taste and hearing.</i>



Science

Humans have 5 main senses. These are hearing, sight, smell, touch and taste. Our senses are important because they send messages to our brain and help us understand what is happening around us.

Sight

Our eyes use light to help us to see. The eye is made up of different parts in the diagram.



Hearing

Our ears help us to hear. Sounds travel through our ears to send messages to our brain.



Smell

We can use our nose to smell things. Our sense of smell can also warn us about possible dangers, for example if we smell smoke.



Taste

The top surface of the tongue is covered in taste buds. We can taste four separate flavours; sweet, salt, bitter and sour.

Lent lasts for 40 days. It starts on Ash Wednesday and ends on Easter Sunday.




Computing
