Key concepts:

Genres and movements of art- alike pop art surrealism had a era where is was most popular and first came about - the surrealism movement (mid 1920's)

Expression art - artists use creating and making as a means of expression of mood, their personality and interests.

Analysing of composition - surreal art has an intended and deliberate order of composition. As artists we need to analyse this and depict the meaning of the suggestion.

Surrealism

Surrealism is a term used to describe art that is in a sense unrealistic. Surreal art is expressive, it can express truth or fiction. Lots of artists use surrealism as a way to express their theories or views in a visual way. Surrealism means "above realism".

Artist research and references

"Have no fear of perfection - you'll never reach it"

Salvador Dali was a Spanish surrealism artist who was best known for his striking and bizarre surreal art creations. He was considered to have been one of the greatest surrealism artists of all time.

When was the surrealism movement?

The movement began in the mid-1920s in France and was born out of an earlier movement called **Dadaism** from Switzerland. peak in the 1930s.

Expression and personal art

Surreal art is a way to express yourself with imperfections and a focus on meaning rather than the way something looks. Expression plays a huge part when creating surreal art, you create from your mind not from reality or real life. Exercises such as drawing from memory and continuous line drawing can be used to record thoughts and feelings.

Critical Analysis: artist research:

What do we know about the artist?
 What is the theme or genre of the work?
 Is the work realistic/abstract/surreal?
 What message does the work communicate?
 What media/materials/tools has the artist used?

What colour groups does the artist use?
 What shapes does the artist use? Why?
 What mark-making techniques does the artist use? Why?
 How big is the work? Why did the artist choose this scale?
 Does the artist have a recognisable style. If so, explain what made you think this.
 How does the work make you feel? Explain.
 Does the colour, texture, form, theme, composition effect your mood?

History of art

Fact - Surrealism began as a philosophical movement that said the way to find truth in the world was through the subconscious mind and dreams.

Expression: the action of making known one's thoughts or feelings.

Aesthetics: The aesthetics of something is the way in which it looks.

Illusion: in art this is an image that can confuse or mislead you

Continuous line drawing: creating a drawing or piece of art without lifting of your pen or pencil.

Drawing from memory: creating a drawing or piece of art from what is in your mind or existing memory.
