Secondary

Badminton League 2021

This year we entered 2 teams in the KS3 badminton league. We were drawn in a group against All Saints Catholic High School, Tapton, Outwood Academy City and Parkwood.

Our first fixture at All Saints was the first time that all of our pupils had competed in a competitive match. After just a few training sessions we were even reading the rules on the bus on the way to All Saints! Mrs Kelley and Mr Ramster took 2 teams of 4 boys who played a mixture of singles and doubles games. Every game finished with a close score line and the boys were competitive throughout. The final tally: **OADV 9 – All Saints 11.**

The second fixture saw Park Academy come to the EIS to play a full round of fixtures. With more practices under our belt and a mixture of both girls and boys, we were confident with the rules and game play. Our students clearly outplayed the Park Academy students but they still played with a high level of sportsmanship and encouraged the opposition throughout. Final tally: **OADV 17 – Park Academy 3.**

Our second away fixture was at Outwood Academy City where we took some new players who had been attending the training sessions for a couple of weeks. Our matches were all competitive and saw some excellent play from both the singles and doubles games but City just had the edge. Final tally: **OADV 13 – City 20.**

Our final fixture we were prepared to be the hardest as we took on Tapton at home at the EIS. We once again fielded some new players who had not been to any competitions yet and even had a home crowd of supporters. We were matched better than we had expected to be and some early wins gave the boys confidence. Final tally: **OADV 11 – Tapton 9.**

Overall in the league our A team finished 3rd and our B team 5th.

Y7 Futsal Tournament

10 Y7 boys headed off to Tapton to take part in a futsal tournament against 4 other schools. Having not had a practice for 6 weeks it took some time to get into the swing of things. Unfortunately, the boys were beaten in all of their games but they kept playing hard and showed a really positive attitude towards their competitors. After a sing along on the bus they returned to school in high spirits.

On an evening where there was a storm threatening stop play, Mrs Kelley and 10 Y8 boys headed across the city to Tapton. We were entered into a tournament with Tipton's A and B team and Parkwood's A and B team. It was a rocky start as our B team conceded an own goal in the first minute of the first game but they eventually pulled together to make sure the defence was tight. After a full round robin of games both our teams finished in equal 4th place and headed into the B and C finals. All the boys got stuck in and enjoyed the evening.

Home learning expectations

Every day, pupils will be expected to study for around one hour and a half. Home learning will be in three parts:

1. Knowledge Organisers and quizzing – 20 minutes
2. Reading for Pleasure – 30 minutes
3. Online Platform Learning (e.g., Quizlet/GCSEPod/Seneca /Hegarty/PiXL) and assigned tasks – 40 minutes
4. Controlled assessment / portfolio / classwork – as directed

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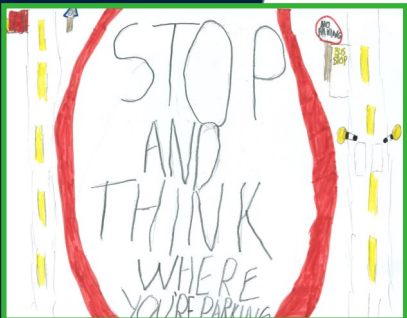
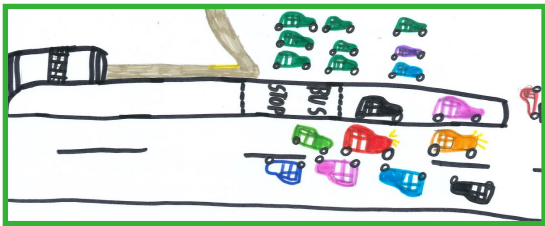
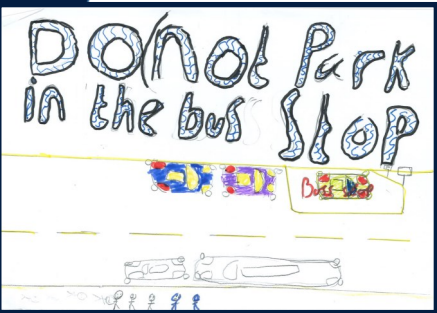


Parking Issues
